Discussion Questions

- 1. What purpose do you think God has for allowing this coronavirus (and perhaps other life events) to affect your life in such a major way? How hard is it for you to really trust God when He doesn't reveal everything to you? How does not knowing everything in advance encourage you to always listen to His voice through reading the Bible and in prayer?
- 2. What are some things in life that you were not willing to give up or adjust for the Lord? How has this life interruption forced you to realize that you didn't need to hold so tightly to certain practices and things? Will you now be more flexible and adaptable for the Lord, sensitive to the leading of the Holy Spirit?
- 3. Do you agree or disagree that it is God's best for your life that you undergo this major life interruption? What spiritual lessons have you learned from this life interruption? Will you commit to inviting the Lord to

"interrupt your life" anytime He feels it necessary?

Respond

In Walk:

"For My thoughts are not your thoughts, Nor are your ways My ways," says the Lord. Isaiah 55:8

Covid-19 disrupted us, yet in the midst of this life's disruption is God's interruption. He interrupts us to teach us to trust Him, to be flexible and adaptable to the leading of the Holy Spirit, to help us listen to His voice, and to give us His best.
