Keys to Victory OVER OUR TRIALS

Exodus 17:8-16 | Rev. Victor Ramoy

KEY POINTS

- Our battles expose our need to trust in God's strength and faithfulness (v. 8-10). Key to Victory #1: MOVE FROM SELF-RELIANCE TO GOD-DEPENDENCE
- Our battles can be won through the help of true friends (v. 12-13).
 Key to Victory #2: TURN FROM ISOLATION TO COMMUNITY SUPPORT
- Our battles should lead us to remember and declare God's faithfulness (v. 14-16). Key to Victory #3: TURN FROM FORGETFULNESS TO ACTIVE REMEMBRANCE OF GOD'S FAITHFULNESS

DISCUSS

- 1. In Exodus 17:8-16, the Israelites face the Amalekites. How does this story demonstrate the importance of relying on God's strength in times of conflict or opposition? How can we apply these principles to our own battles in life?
- 2. Moses held up his staff during the battle, and as long as his hands were raised, the Israelites prevailed. What is the significance of this action, and what does it teach us about the power of intercession and dependence on God?
- 3. In verse 11, when Moses' hands grew tired and began to lower, Aaron and Hur provided support and held Moses' hands up. How does this display the beauty of supporting each other to contribute to the victory of the Israelites? What lessons can we learn from this example about the importance of friends, community, and mutual encouragement in our own battles? Share an instance where a friend came alongside to help you during your trying times.

- 4. God instructed Moses to write down the account of the battle with the Amalekites and to recite it to Joshua. Why do you think it was important for this event to be remembered and passed down through generations? What is the significance of recounting and sharing stories of God's faithfulness in our own lives?
- 5. Moses built an altar and called it "The LORD is My Banner" (Exodus 17:15). What does this name signify, and how does it reflect the Israelites' understanding of God's role in their victory? How can we view God as our banner in the battles we face?

REFLECT

As we face another day this coming week, may we be reminded that our God who is powerful and faithful is with us no matter what season of life we are in today. Just as He was faithful to His people, the Israelites, He will also be faithful to us and we can fully rely and depend on our God to carry us through. So let us live on, fulfilling God's given purpose for our lives, knowing well that we are not alone in accomplishing the tasks that is set before us – we have God and true friends who will support us as we continue to obey and trust in the Lord.

PRAY

Gracious and loving Heavenly Father, I come before You today with an open heart and mind, seeking guidance and understanding as I study Your Word. Help me, O Lord, to recognize that true power lies not in human effort or earthly strategies but in humble reliance on Your mighty hand. May I learn to lift my hands in prayer and surrender, acknowledging that it is Your grace and guidance that leads me to victory over life's challenges. Teach me to remember and to acknowledge Your faithfulness in every season of my life and may I build an altar in my heart testifying to Your unwavering love and grace, and may this altar become a reminder of Your faithfulness to those who come after me. Finally, O Lord, I pray that the lessons I learned from this passage will not end at just my personal study, but will move me to live as Your faithful follower.
