MESSAGE

NOTES

The book of Proverbs offers practical guidance for wise and righteous living. Here are three biblical principles from Proverbs 16:1-9 that you can follow to help you plan your year.

Remember to include God in your planning (v. 1-3)

 It encourages us to acknowledge God's sovereignty and discernment and actively involve Him in our planning, as well as challenges us to surrender our limited perspectives, purify our motives, and commit our works to the Lord.

Remember God in your planning because He is in control of the future (v. 4-8)

God already knows what lies ahead of our plans, the first steps we
will take and even the detours and roadblocks we will face along
the way. Our response should be in humility not in pride.

Prioritize righteousness in your planning (v. 7-9; Psalm 37:3-6)

 When we prioritize righteousness in our planning, we're aligning our plans with God's purposes, ensuring that our journey is not only efficient but also pleasing to Him.
