NOTES

Don't believe everything you hear. Fact check, remembering there may be another truth (v. 16-21)

Get to the heart of the issue, not allowing bias to color your judgment (v. 22-23)

Take time to understand people, their emotions, and their natural tendencies (v. 24-26)

REFLECT and DISCUSS

- I. Take a few minutes to talk about the message. Which part do you particularly relate with?
- 2. What are the potential consequences of unquestioningly accepting information without verification? Can you share an example from your own experience where fact-checking saved you from making a wrong decision, or when *not* fact-checking got you in trouble?
- 3. In what ways can bias affect decision-making in your personal relationships, politics, or the school or workplace? How can you identify and moderate your own biases when evaluating information so that you can keep to the heart of an issue?
- 4. How can empathy contribute to better relationships? Share a situation where a deeper understanding of someone's emotions changed the dynamics of a conversation or relationship.
