MESSAGE

NOTES

A life that radiates joy, gladness, and gratitude comes from recognizing God's majesty and sovereignty and living in the light of His character and promises. It inspires joyful living and worship that draws others to Him, as demonstrated by King Solomon in 1 Kings 8:1-66.

God's majesty and glory should cause us to worship Him (v. 1-11)

God's promise-keeping character encourages us to trust in Him (v. 12-21)

God's mercy and forgiveness is not a license to sin but a call for repentance (v. 22-53)

God's love and faithfulness result in joy and gladness of heart (v. 54-66)

REFLECT and DISCUSS

- Take a few minutes to talk about the message. What specifically stood out to you or challenged your perspective about life or faith?
- 2. What comes to your mind when you think about God? What does it elicit in you? How can you create a daily practice that reminds you to reflect on God's majesty and respond in worship?
- 3. Identify a promise of God that you need to trust more fully in your current circumstances. What practical step can you take this week to demonstrate that trust?
- 4. Is there an area of your life where you need to turn back to God in genuine repentance? What specific action will you take to make that change?
- 5. Choose one aspect of your life where you can better reflect God's glory to those around you. What is one specific action you will take this week to make that happen?
