MESSAGE

Watch the sermon. As you watch, use the outline to follow along or take notes on anything that stands out to you.

NOTES

1. Life often throws unexpected challenges our way, disrupting our plans and causing us to question God's goodness.
2. God's answers to our prayers may not always align with our expectations.
3. Expressing our doubts and questions to God is an act of faith.
4. Our joy should not be dependent on our external conditions but rooted in our relationship with God, who is our strength and salvation.
5. Even when we don't see or understand God's plan, we can trust in His goodness.

REFLECT and DISCUSS

1. Take a few minutes to talk about the message. Note the context of the Bible passage and share observations and parts of the sermon that specifically stood out to you. Note the following:
 - What were the main complaints Habakkuk had about the situation in Judah?
 - How did God respond to Habakkuk's initial complaints?
 - What was Habakkuk's reaction to God's plan to use the Babylonians to punish Judah?
 - How does Habakkuk's attitude change from the beginning to the end of the book?
2. "Even when we are going through a lot, we will eventually realize that God is all we've got." Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
3. How does Habakkuk's journey from questioning to trust reflect your own struggles with faith during difficult times?
4. How does Habakkuk's declaration in chapter 3:17-19 challenge your understanding of joy and worship in the midst of adversity?
5. What does it mean to "live by faith"? In what area(s) of your life do you struggle to trust God's goodness? What specific actions can you take to surrender that area to Him?
