#### Main Idea

God's past promises encourage us in our present struggles as we await future redemption.

## Talk It Through

- 1. People often feel disappointed when promises are broken. Why do you think broken promises impact us so deeply? How do you typically respond when someone doesn't keep their word?
- 2. Unlike human promises, which can be uncertain, God's promises never fail. How have you seen His faithfulness in the past, and how does that encourage you in your current struggles?
- 3. Romans 8:28 says that God works all things together for our good. Are there areas in your life where you find it hard to trust this? How does knowing that God's ultimate goal is to shape you into Christ's image challenge your understanding of "good"?
- 4. Romans 8:30 describes how God's plan of salvation is already complete—justifying, calling, and glorifying us. How does this truth change the way we face uncertainties or struggles today?
- 5. What's one area of your life where you need to let go and trust God's plan more fully? What practical step can you take this week to remind yourself of His faithfulness?
