- A heart that SACRIFICES ("My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?")
- A heart that UNDERSTANDS ("I thirst.")
- A heart that LOVES ("It is finished.")
- A heart that TRUSTS GOD ("Father, into Your hands I commit my spirit!")
