Talk It Through

- 1. Can you think of a time someone showed you a simple act of kindness that really stuck with you? Why do those small gestures often leave a lasting impression? On the flip side, why do we seem to remember more the people who hurt us than those who helped us?
- 2. What does Joseph's story teach us about how God works even when others forget us or fail to appreciate what we've done? How does the way God remembers His people in Scripture shape your understanding of His character?
- 3. Think about a time you felt forgotten or overlooked after doing something good for someone. How did you respond, and what helped you deal with that feeling? When you serve or help others, what expectations—like appreciation or acknowledgment—do you carry, and how might they affect your heart?
- 4. How can you be more intentional about remembering and showing gratitude to those who have blessed or encouraged you recently? What would it look like for you this week to serve someone purely out of love for God, even if no one else notices or remembers?
