» Talk It Through

1. We spend so much of our lives chasing achievements, reputation, and stability. When you think about the idea that all of that fades and we stand before God simply as we are, what does that make you feel or realize?
2. Looking at the passage as a whole, from the personal praise in verse 1 to the corporate declarations in verses 4–5, and considering God's grace, salvation, good works, and greatness, what does it reveal about who God is and how He wants us to relate to Him through both gratitude and testimony? If someone asked you, "What is God like?" based on this message, what would you say? Which aspect of Him feels most real or significant to you right now?
3. When good things happen, do you tend to credit yourself, circumstances, or God? What does that say about how you see God's role in your life?
4. What's one practical thing you could do this week to make praise more of a habit—whether it's noticing His grace, thanking Him for daily protection, sharing something He's done, or taking time to reflect on His greatness?
