Talk It Through

1. The sermon began with a moment of people finally “belonging” during a citizenship ceremony. Have you ever experienced something like that, where you felt truly welcomed or at home? What usually helps people feel like they belong in a community?
2. Psalm 87 shows God forming a people from every nation and background. How does that shape or challenge the way you think about salvation, church life, or even what God is doing in the world?
3. What stood out to you most about God declaring even Israel’s enemies as “born in Zion”? What does that reveal about His heart toward people we might consider far from Him?
4. The sermon ends with this big question: “Does my lifestyle reflect God’s global purpose, or only my personal comfort?” When you honestly sit with that, what does it reveal about your current priorities? What’s one small, practical step you feel you can take this week to better align your life with God’s mission, whether through prayer, relationships, generosity, or sharing your faith?
