- Our sense of genuine safety and security comes from our nearness to God
- God's protection flows from His loving care and is available at all times
- God protects by fighting battles on our behalf and keeping us from harm
- God protects by providing the means, strength, and wisdom to overcome troubles
- God's faithful promise of His presence is our ultimate assurance of safety and security

Talk It Through

1. The sermon mentioned how we keep adding layers of security in life: passwords, backup plans, savings, connections, control. What are the things people today usually rely on to feel safe or secure? Which ones do you personally tend to lean on most?
2. One big idea from Psalm 91 is that real security comes from nearness to God, not from a trouble-free life. What stood out to you most about how this passage describes God's protection and presence?
3. The sermon talked about how we sometimes treat God like an emergency backup plan instead of a daily refuge. When life gets stressful or uncertain, where does your instinct usually go first before God, if you're honest?
4. What is one practical way you can cultivate nearness to God this week, especially in an area where you've been feeling anxious, uncertain, or emotionally tired?
