Talk It Through

1. People have all kinds of opinions about Jesus, teacher, prophet, good moral example, Savior, and more. Growing up, what was your understanding of who Jesus is, and has that changed over time?
2. There were many things people were saying about who Jesus is. In Matthew 16, Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" What does this passage teach us about why a personal conviction about Jesus matters more than secondhand beliefs?
3. The sermon pointed out that who we believe Jesus is shapes how we see reality, the church, and our own lives. Which of these areas is most challenging for you right now, trusting Him with your circumstances, staying committed to the church, or depending on Him in what He has called you to do? Why?
4. Is there an area of your life right now where you need to fix your eyes on Jesus instead of relying on your own understanding, feelings, or strength? What's one area where God is inviting you to trust Him more deeply or take a step of obedience? What might that step look like?
