Talk It Through

1. What do you think people around you tend to use as their measure of success, and how has that influenced the way you measure your own life?
2. Peter, Andrew, James, and John didn't receive a detailed five-year plan when Jesus called them. They simply received an invitation to follow Him. What does their response teach us about faith and following Jesus when we don't know where He is leading us?
3. The sermon described discipleship as being close enough to Jesus to “carry His dust,” meaning we stay close to Him, become more like Him, and obey Him. When you look at your life right now, which of these three areas, closeness, becoming like Jesus, or obedience, is strongest for you? Which one needs the most growth?
4. The sermon challenged us to ask not just, “What do I want to become?” but “Lord, what can You make of what You have already given me?” Think about your own abilities, experiences, career, education, relationships, and opportunities. Which part of your life have you mostly viewed as something for your own success, rather than something God could use for His purposes?
5. The sermon mentioned having *nets* (things we depend on for security) and *Zebedees* (people or priorities that compete with Jesus for our highest loyalty). What are your nets and Zebedees that you may need to loosen your grip on so that you can follow Jesus more freely? What would taking that step look like this week?
